

# Quick and Easy Christmas Ornament

## Materials

**head and body:** scraps of yarn (colors: white, red, yellow, light and dark blue), suitable for 2,5 mm hook

**wings:** very thin yarn white, thin golden thread

## Abbreviations

sc	single crochet
dc	double crochet
ch	chain
st	stitch
inc	increase
dec	decrease by crocheting two stitches together

<b>Head</b> <i>In a spiral</i>	White yarn	1) 2 ch, 6 sc in 2 <sup>nd</sup> ch from hook
		2) inc every st = 12 sc
		3) inc every 3 <sup>rd</sup> st = 16 sc
		4) – 6) 16 sc
		7) *2 sc, dec* repeat from * 3 times = 12 sc
		8) dec 6 times = 6 sc
<b>Gown</b> <i>In a spiral</i>	Change color	9) 6 sc
		10) inc every 2 <sup>nd</sup> st = 9 sc
		11) inc every 3 <sup>rd</sup> st = 12 sc
		12) inc every 2 <sup>nd</sup> st = 18 sc
		13) inc every 3 <sup>th</sup> st = 24 sc
		14) inc every 4 <sup>th</sup> st = 30 sc
		15) – 17) 30 sc
		18) inc every 5 <sup>th</sup> st = 36 sc
		19) – 23) 36 sc
Finish off. Twitch skirt into folds and sew them into place (easiest way is to draw a yarn through the inner folds at about half the length of the gown and knot it securely).		
<b>Wings</b>	Thin white yarn and golden thread together	1) 2 ch, 6 sc in 2 <sup>nd</sup> chain from hook, do NOT close circle, 2 ch, turn
		2) 2 dc into each sc, 2 ch, turn = 12 dc 3) 2 dc into each dc, 2 ch, turn = 24 dc 4) *inc sc, sc* repeat from * 10 times, inc sc, 3 sc into last sc, crochet over open segment of circle, sc into first dc from last row. Finish off and attach wings to back of figure. Add a bit of golden thread to the head, so you can hang the figure into your Christmas tree.
