Rise Up Celebration Service at Mary Sumner House

On Wednesday, 22 May 2024, the team at Mary Sumner House hosted the Rise Up celebration service. Members from the dioceses of London, Southwark, Rochester, and Chelmsford gathered in large numbers to support this campaign against domestic abuse. The chapel at MSH was illuminated with laughter, happy faces, and a spirit of unity as it played host to the service under the pastoral ministration of the Very Revd Rod Reid, MU diocesan chaplain for the Diocese of Chelmsford. Revd Reid delivered a thought-provoking sermon on the importance of listening to survivors in a world full of both good and evil, and he thanked Mothers' Union for rising up to the challenge of tackling this critical issue.

Since its launch in the last quarter of 2023, Rise Up has received massive support from the membership. As of the last count, a remarkable 89 branches/dioceses have achieved the bronze level, 3 have been awarded silver, and a further 3 have reached the gold level. This remarkable achievement demonstrates the dedication and steadfast commitment of Mothers' Union members who immediately took action. It showcases their profound devotion to their communities and their determination to bring the critical issue of domestic abuse out of the shadows and into the light, where it can be addressed with compassion, support, and a collective resolve to create a safer, more just society for all.

We are deeply thankful for every diocese and branch that has wholeheartedly embraced the Rise Up challenge, knowing that it is making a significant impact in homes and churches throughout the country. As our Patron, The Most Revd Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury, says, "Mothers' Union is the heart and love of the Church."

While this marks a significant moment in our campaign, our work is far from over. The message of Rise Up has reached tens of thousands, but we must continue working tirelessly to ensure that every individual can live free from domestic abuse, both in our local communities and around the world.

Epic 90-mile walk @90

In celebration of her upcoming ninetieth birthday, Pam Brooks is embarking on an extraordinary ninety-mile trek along the stunning Sussex coastline. Her mission? To raise vital funds for the Literacy and Financial Education Programme of the Mothers' Union in Burundi. This walk is also a heartfelt tribute to her dear friend Pelagie Simbinuba, the beloved Mothers' Union leader in Matana Diocese, Burundi, who tragically passed away earlier this year.

Starting in Selsey and concluding at Winchelsea Beach near the Kent border, Pam will navigate the picturesque landscape of Sussex from July 5th to July 16th. She will walk alongside friends, tackling nine legs over twelve days, to support church projects through the Mothers' Union literacy programme in one of the world's most impoverished nations.

Pam, now living in Rustington, West Sussex, with her husband Pat, has deep connections with Burundi dating back to 1957 when Pat first went there with the Church Mission Society. The Brooks lived in Burundi until 1979 and continued visiting annually over Lent until 2014. During these visits, Pam's passion for supporting local communities flourished as she explored the hills of Burundi, visiting projects initiated by Mothers' Union groups to promote literacy and income-generating activities.

When asked about her inspiration, Sam shared, "I wanted to commemorate my birthday in a meaningful way, but the thought of extreme activities like skydiving or cliff abseiling didn't resonate with me. Instead, I invite others to join me as we explore the breathtaking Sussex coastline together."

Fatherhood in Today's World: Navigating the Teenage Years

Five years ago, Robert Dawes from the Development team shared his story of what it was like becoming a father for the first time. His story serves as a poignant reminder of the unique journey that fathers embark upon, filled with excitement, uncertainty, and a deep sense of responsibility.

Rob recounted that when he became a father 14 years ago, he experienced a whirlwind of emotions – excitement at the prospect of welcoming a new life into the world, nervousness about the responsibilities that lay ahead, and uncertainty about what the future holds in store. Now, as his daughter enters her teenage years and his son follows closely behind at 9 years old, Rob finds himself navigating uncharted territory.

Raising teenagers in today's world is no joke as parents are presented with a unique set of challenges that previous generations may not have encountered. The digital age, with its constant influx of information and social media influence, has reshaped the landscape of adolescence. As if raising teenagers is not hard enough, parents must also navigate the digital world alongside your child, ensuring their safety and wellbeing while also respecting their needs for privacy and independence. Striking the right balance between monitoring and trust is a delicate dance that requires patience, understanding, and open dialogue.

For many parents raising teenagers, one of the most significant challenges is maintaining open lines of communication with your children. As teenagers often seek autonomy and privacy, it can be difficult for parents to stay connected and understand the complexities of their children's lives. Like many parents, Rob recognises the importance of creating a safe and non-judgmental environment where his children feel comfortable sharing their thoughts, concerns, and experiences. Despite the challenges, Rob finds immense joy and fulfilment in his role as a father. Watching his children grow and develop into unique individuals is a source of pride and wonder. He recognises that fatherhood has taught him invaluable lessons about unconditional love, patience, and the importance of leading by example.

Rob also shared in his interview that one of his greatest rewards through this experience is the deepening of his understanding of God's love. He said as a father, he has gained a profound appreciation for the sacrificial love that God has for His children. Through the joys and challenges of fatherhood, Rob has gained a deeper appreciation for the various dimensions of God's love – unconditional, sacrificial, patient, providing, and forgiving – which has strengthened his understanding of what it means to have God as a Heavenly Father.

Raising teenagers in today's world calls us to depend on God to give us wisdom and insight to love them unconditionally. As we celebrate Father's Day, let us honour the sacrifices and dedication of fathers like Rob, who navigate the complexities of parenthood with grace, wisdom, and a steadfast commitment to their children's well-being.

May they be blessed with patience and understanding.
