1. A Special Reception at Lambeth Palace with Nigeria's First Lady

It was a great honour to represent the Mothers' Union at a special reception held at Lambeth Palace, where we had the privilege of meeting the First Lady of Nigeria, Her Excellency, Mrs Oluremi Tinubu.



During this memorable occasion, we were delighted to present her with a copy of the Mothers' Union Prayer Diary and the 150th Anniversary Prayer Book. She expressed genuine appreciation on learning that Mothers' Union members across the world regularly uphold dioceses in

Nigeria in prayer through the Wave of Prayer. This was a powerful reminder of the global fellowship that unites us in faith and purpose.

Mothers' Union was represented at the reception by our CEO, Canon Bev Julien, Sarah Newnham, Director of Global Programmes, Mrs. Comfort Idowu-Fearon, Provincial President for Canterbury, and Atim Abrams from the Membership team, as seen here in the photograph.

The visit also provided a valuable opportunity to share the impact and reach of the Mothers' Union, and we were pleased to be interviewed for Nigerian television, further strengthening these international connections. This was a significant and encouraging moment, affirming the importance of our prayer life and the strength of our worldwide fellowship.

We are also pleased to highlight a wonderful contribution from Revd Anne Marr of Newcastle Diocese, who has recorded a video of **Mary Sumner's personal prayer in sign language**. This initiative enables even more people to engage with the prayer, helping us to be more inclusive and ensuring that its message can be shared as widely as possible.

This video will be promoted on our social media channels, and we encourage members to look out for it, share it, and use it within their own communities. Together, these resources reflect our ongoing commitment to accessible, creative, and inclusive worship across Mothers' Union.

5. Mothers' Union and Church-Based Toddler Groups

This month we have re-connected with the 1277 Make Them Count movement, which is a network for church-based toddler groups and leaders. Did you know that in the UK on average a child has 1,277 days between birth and starting nursery school education? One of the initiatives of 1277 is the National Month of Prayer for Toddler Groups (NMOP) that takes place every June. The theme for 2026 is based on John 10:14-16 'Jesus the Good Shepherd' and we have been invited to the launch on 1 June in Parliament. Toddler groups are such an important outreach to families, and we know that many MU members either lead or volunteer at church-based toddler groups. We would love to hear how many groups our members are involved in, and what they are planning for the NMOP this year, so do let Lucy know by emailing faith@mothersunion.org.

We may be able to offer places to the NMOP launch event for some of our MU members who lead church-based toddler groups.
