Since writing, you may have seen the news that The Very Reverend John Witcombe, Dean of Coventry has announced that he is to retire on May 31st 2026. Dean John has held the position since January 2013, and will have served 42 years in ordained ministry. Dean John has always been a steadfast supporter of Mothers' Union within Coventry Cathedral and I know you will join with me in praying for Dean John as he prepares to hand over the baton.

The installation of Rt Revd and Rt Hon. Dame Sarah Mullally as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury

Dame Sarah Mullally, as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury, due to take place at Canterbury Cathedral on March 25, 2026, the Feast of the Annunciation.
