For those of you that attended the MU virtual business meeting on Thursday, I did confirm a link would be available today but having investigated this further, there is now a delay so apologies for any inconvenience caused. There is an expectation that the live link for tickets will now be available from next Thursday, 16th October so please do keep your eyes peeled.

Modern Slavery (13th Oct to 19th Oct)

Anti-Slavery day takes place every year on $18^{\rm th}$ October with Anti-Slavery Sunday being the next day. Throughout the week there is an opportunity to raise awareness within our church community that over 49.6 million people in the world today, and an estimated 122,000 people in the UK are trapped in conditions of modern slavery.

Thank you to those who have been knitting chains (a powerful symbol) to raise awareness about modern slavery in church. Interestingly, there are no official statistics for the total estimated number of people in modern slavery in Coventry. However, in 2024, the <u>Coventry City Council</u> received 167 reports of adult exploitation, with the most common types of exploitation being labour exploitation, criminal exploitation, and sexual exploitation. Modern slavery is a hidden crime, making it difficult to accurately identify and count all victims, therefore, the number is no doubt higher than the statistics suggest.

Within the latest edition of Connected on page 25, there is a useful grid to follow and use as a checklist to encourage engagement and prayerful reflection. Did you know over the last few years, the Clewer Initiative and Mothers' Union have formed a vital partnership, united in their goal to end modern slavery? New modern slavery resources will shortly be added to the central Mothers' Union website. - 2. Commit to pray for those affected by domestic abuse, including the victims, survivors, perpetrators, and those who work in the field of domestic abuse.
- 3. Make a connection with your local domestic abuse support organisation to see how you can support them. You could offer moving in and moving on packages.

The Counting Dead Women Vigil

This will be the 5th year that a group of local women organise the Counting Dead Women Vigil, due to take place on Saturday, 29th November at 9am to 4pm, located in Coventry city centre just outside WH Smiths. The aim of the vigil is to honour the UK women killed in male violence throughout the year, to raise awareness of domestic abuse and to showcase local support services. Each women's name will be read aloud ever hour on the hour and a huge display of shoes to represent each one that has died ensures many shoppers stop to listen and to reflect.
